January Report January 2013



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Summary:

Project Hope continues to make an invaluable contribution to the communities which we serve – an achievement which appears all the more impressive once our limited volunteer resources are taken into account. Over the course of the last month Project Hope ran 46 classes and activities and its volunteers (9 international and 14 local) provided educational programs to 608 Palestinian children, young adults and adults.

These services were provided across the West Bank – in January alone, 27 English (two new English classes were added during the month) and 11 French classes were held in Palestinian villages (Beit Foreek, Aseerah, Jneed and Boreen), refugee camps (Balata and Old/New Askar) and our home city of Nablus.

Project Hope's volunteers have also been learning over the past month. On the 5th and 6th, 15 volunteer staff members took part in a training session which was led by Myriam Benamza, a French psychotherapist and art therapist who specializes in sexual abuse and the treatment of trauma. The workshop introduced volunteers to the different causes of trauma and helped them to understand its severe consequences.

In a separate initiative, our volunteers spoke to Francois Beaune, a French Writer, about their experiences during their time with us. Their interviews were recorded and stored on an internet data base for future reference.

General Program overview:

Local and international instructors taught a range of 9 different subjects including language courses (at five different levels) in English (both conversational and professional), French, Dutch, and arts. During this period, Project Hope organized classes and activities at 17 centers. The ages of our volunteers ranged from 20 to 60 years old.
